

Wauponsee Township Board Meetings

Wauponsee Township Board regular meetings are held monthly on the dates posted at the Township Hall and on the web site. In general, the meetings are held on the second Tuesday or Wednesday of every month.

The meetings are open to the public as stipulated by the State of Illinois. The Township Supervisor conducts the meeting following a meeting agenda. The items that are generally covered include approval of Township and Road District expenditures, reports from elected officials and a review of budget status. The meetings usually last about one hour.

The meeting agenda includes an opportunity for public comment usually at the beginning of the meeting. The Township has no restrictions on addressing the Board as long as the comments are voiced at the appropriate time of the meeting and are relevant to the Township.

The Township Supervisor has the responsibility to recognize visitors for comments, to maintain order and decorum during the meeting and call an end to comments when it seems appropriate.

The Board will likely not respond immediately to issues brought before it in the public comments portion of the agenda. Each issue requires thorough examination from all aspects before a response is given.
